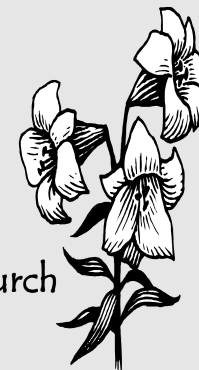

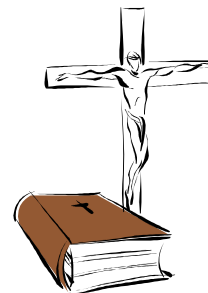
## Introducing Julie Rogers Our New Administrative Assistant

## North Central Association UCC Spring Meeting April 17

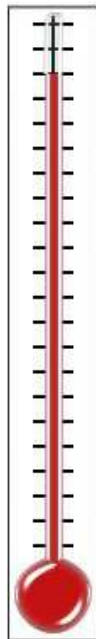

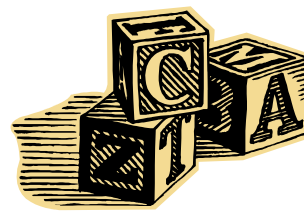
## Let's CHANGE the World

**The Way of Social Engagement.** Is Liberation Theology, a 20<sup>th</sup> century development, a spirituality? We will look at a few of the pioneering Liberation theologians.
