## From Victory Garden to

### Community Garden

The idea of a church victory garden came to me after I had read the stunning statistics that about a billion people in the world are hungry and about a billion people are over fed. One in eight Americans does not know where the next meal will come from. When I asked a friend how I could get the food that is too abundant to the place where it is needed, my friend said, "I don't know, but you'll have to start small." While walking to church on a Sunday I walked through our empty lot and all of a sudden I saw a garden in my mind. And sure enough with the help of people like R.C and Melissa Jones who dug up the garden, The Lewis' who loaned us their rototiller, the Smits who built the rabbit fence, and others who donated vegetables, we now have a victory garden.

The idea of the victory garden came about during WWII when much of the food produced in our country needed to be sent to the Allied Forces. The Government called on people to raise Victory Gardens. Eleanor Roosevelt even planted one on the White House Lawn, and by the end of World War II 22 million gardens had been planted, and Americans were raising 40% of their own food.

So now we have a garden. I spend about 7-10 hours tending, weeding and watering it each week. But I need your help. I want people who raise vegetables at home to bring the extra to church. I need someone to pick what is in our garden and put it out on a table during fellowship hour. People are encouraged to take as much as they want, and you can make a contribution. Pay less than you would at the store, otherwise it won't work. The money, will be divided between the Breadbasket and Second Helping. Any vegetables or herbs not taken after fellowship time will be donated to Second Helping for either the evening meal or to be given away to our guests. So if our church gets good organic vegetables cheaply, and if The Breadbasket and Second Helping gets money and if our guests get better food, then I think that we all win.

This fall I hope to take the north part of the garden and invite people to plant bulbs to that we will have flowers next spring for the sanctuary. I need lots of help to turn our victory garden into a garden where the community benefits. If you are willing to help, let me know. You can contact me at 537-7006.

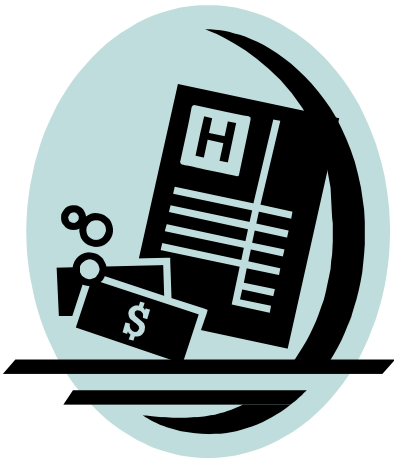

The choir has presented concerts at many of the most prestigious musical cathedrals in Europe, including St. Mark's Cathedral in Venice, Italy, the Thomaskirche in Leipzig, Germany, and the Dom of Cologne, Germany.
