other people's point of view. Wonder, often, about their motivations and try to see things from their vantage point.

I recently read an article in the Christian Science Monitor about studies that show the use of words like "love," "patience," "faithfulness," "humility," "modesty," and "kindness" have decreased 50% in the modern age. People don't talk or write about these virtues as much as they used to. Friends, this is why the work we are doing together is so very important. 2020 Elections

As we enter 2020 (yikes! How can this be?), we will be inundated with information about upcoming elections. **As a Church**, there are rules that we must follow due to our tax exempt status. We, as a church, cannot endorse candidates or political parties in any way. We also cannot campaign against any candidates seeking office. We can, of course, discuss or endorse issues, but not candidates.

Bylaws Update

Do you know how pulling down that old wallpaper also reminds you that those cabinets really need refinishing too? Just like a “minor” kitchen update, that’s how a major update of First Congregational’s bylaws came to be during this last year. You are invited to consider the updates – approved by Cabinet in its December meeting – and to join others at the annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, January 26, 2020 to vote on the proposed changes.

The most notable changes relate to—

- Transferring legal responsibility from the Board of Trustees to Cabinet.
- Renaming the Board of Trustees as the Board of Facilities given the transfer of legal and financial responsibility to Cabinet.

- Changing the scope of the Vitality Committee and renaming it as the Board of Justice and Witness to match what the national setting of the UCC calls social justice work like ours.
- Replacing the Nominating Committee with a Membership Engagement Committee that will continue to facilitate the nomination process and take on new membership duties of the former Vitality Committee.
- Creating a new Finance Committee to align financial responsibilities with the corporate responsibilities of Cabinet rather than the Trustees.
- Renaming the Audit Committee as the Financial Oversight Committee and clarifying responsibilities based on feedback from the last financial review completed in 2018.

In November, Second Helping served 161 Sunday suppers and distributed 170 sack breakfast/lunches (that's 501 meals!). Volunteers who helped by cooking, planning, making desserts, and crewing totaled 49! Unfortunately, our numbers are increasing and we are no longer receiving Recovery food from the K-State training table. What to help? Besides donating cereal bars and oatmeal packets, we need creamed soups, pasta and pasta sauce, and canned vegetables. Like to bake? We could use cookies for our sack lunches. You can pack your homemade cookies, place in freezer proof bags, label, and stick in the freezer in the kitchen. Homemade are so much better! You can also sign up for bringing dessert some Sunday.

Cobb Corner — Going Green

Happy New Year! 2020 is a good opportunity to challenge ourselves toward positive and critically important action.

“You’ll never be bored

There’s really no limit

Charles Lindbergh was only 25 in 1927 when he made his solo flight across the Atlantic to become not only the first but also the youngest to be named *Time* magazine’s Person of the Year. Until this year when Swedish 16-year old Greta Thunberg became this year’s Person of the Year for her amazing work promoting urgent efforts to combat climate change.

Greta has sworn off flying, citing the emissions crisis surrounding flight. In Europe rail travel has soared and flights have decreased significantly. She has also inspired millions of school children around the world to strike for action on the climate crisis.

I think Charles Lindbergh would have been supportive. In his later years he became an environmentalist. “If I had to chose, “he said,” I would rather have birds than airplanes.” *Time*, December 23-30, 2019, p. 10.

Today, tens of millions are devoted to action against the perils of climate change. “Chill, Greta, chill” tweeted President Trump, the globe’s foremost denier of climate science. But his stance is increasingly reminiscent of flat-earth proponents.

I’m no scientist , but as a young girl in the 1950s my fear was nuclear war. I never dreamed that life on earth could end as a consequence of inaction, indifference, obliviousness, and selfishness. In the 1980s, I started including study of global warming or as Tom Friedman more aptly called it “global weirding” in my public policy classes. Al Gore’s *Earth in the Balance* and later his film “An Inconvenient Truth” were added to my course. But it is only in the 2020 election campaign that climate change has become a major issue.

The majority of Americans in contrast to Europeans don’t recycle or compost. Many continue to idle their cars at drive-up windows rather than simply parking and [continued next page]

going inside. A majority, myself included, too often drive when we could more cheaply and safely use convenient public transit. Consider how few even carry recyclable bags when they shop. Will 2020 be any different?
