Finding a Way Together at General Synod

Greetings from Baltimore! As you read this piece, I am gathered at the 2017 General Synod of the United Church of Christ with thousands of other UCCers from all over the nation. This biennial event pulls together delegates, visitors, and people from across the nation to consider the issues facing our 21st century church. This is the second time I've had an opportunity to attend a General Synod - the first time was 10 years ago for the 50th anniversary celebration in Hartford. You might also recall that our congregation sent Kerri Keller and Amanda Tross as delegates to the 2015 Synod.

My colleague, the Rev. Heidi Carrington Heath recently shared with me this helpful information: "the word 'synod' comes from the Greek 'sun' (together) and 'hodos' (way) = 'sunodos' (meeting) which, in time evolved to the word synod in Middle English. It generally refers to a gathering of clergy [continued pg. 2]

or church-types. But I appreciate its Greek origins, because so much of what we are doing is finding a 'way together.'"

This "finding a way together" is one of the things I cherish about our denomination. We are all travelers together, seeking to live into the Ways of Jesus. We claim Christ as our head and take seriously the call to be in covenant with one another - holding community as sacred even across differences of opinion. Speaking of differences of opinion - those happen at General Synod! There is much diversity in the UCC - we represent many geographical areas, cultures, races, political and theological viewpoints. We share varied understandings of what it means to "be the church" in the 21st century.

Synod is a time for careful discernment. One of the things that happens at Synod is committee work around various resolutions for our consideration. We explore contemporary issues and the Synod makes decisions about what kinds of things we want our churches to consider in the future. Unlike other denominations with a "top-down" governance model, the Synod does not tell individual churches how to follow Christ, but it does bear witness to what we collectively discern to be important and worthy of consideration. I've frequently heard it said that the Synod does not speak FOR the UCC, but it does speak TO the UCC. I find that distinction helpful!

Synod is also a time for celebration. We will have opportunities to worship, hear about what's happening in the wider church, and be engaged by thoughtful preachers and speakers. I am particularly looking forward to hearing the Rev. Dr. William Barber, the Rev. Traci Blackmon, and Glennon Doyle (Melton). You can learn more about the full schedule and stream many of the worship services at speakers via the Synod website.

Finally, Synod is a time for connection. I am looking forward to meeting up with friends and colleagues that I've known for years AND meeting new people. I will be attending as a part of the Next Generation Leadership Initiative (NGLI) so I'll be spending time with my cohort and talking shop about what we observe and how it might affect our own ministry. If you have a moment to pray for the stamina of everyone attending, we'd surely appreciate it. The days are long - often beginning before 7am and ending well after 10pm. We cram a lot of work into the week!

Our Whole Lives Training

Our Whole Lives: Sexuality Education for Young Adults and Adults is a curriculum created by the United Church of Christ and the Unitarian Universalists. The *Our*

Whole Lives program was developed to create a positive and comprehensive lifespan educational program that helps participants gain the knowledge, values and skills they need to lead sexually healthy, responsible lives. The Adult sessions provide a time to learn about extraordinarily rich and complex area of human behavior, and opportunity to better understand sexuality and self and a space for growth beyond present limits and concerns.

There will be a facilitator training session in Olathe, KS on July 21-23 (starts late Friday and ends Sunday afternoon). If you are interested in being trained as a facilitator, this is a wonderful opportunity. Please contact Tracey Weston if you are interested. After completion of the training, it is the goal to offer some Adult workshops in combination with our church and the Unitarian Fellowship later this fall/winter, and to coordinate Young Adult workshops at Ecumenical Christian Ministries.

Name Tags = Hospitality

As we prepare to welcome newcomers this fall, a quick reminder to please wear your name tag each Sunday during worship. Name tags help new people learn our names and faces quickly. They also make it easier for you to identify a new person when they are attending worship - and welcome them warmly! If you do not have a permanent name tag, please contact the church office to ask for one. When new name tags are made, they "debut" in the lobby near the kitchen so you can find them easily. If you see a new person, please ask them if they'd like a name tag and let them know they can simply make a note of it in the attendance pad on Sunday morning. Another way you can greet our visitors warmly is to offer them a bag of popcorn and thank them for "popping in." The popcorn is located in the small table in the narthex (the entry off Poyntz). If you see families with young children, be sure to help them by showing them the pew cards with information about our children's ministries. And, as always, it's always lovely to offer to walk someone into coffee hour after worship, visit for a few minutes, and then introduce them to someone new. ECM Notebook

Ecumenical Campus Ministry is a cooperative ministry at K-State supported by the Presbyterian Church (USA), the United Church of Christ, and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). www.ksu.edu/ecm

One of the many positive changes resulting from the Ecumenical Campus Ministry's move two years ago was the expansion of our "housing ministry" with students. Instead of having two students live at ECM, we now provide housing for a dozen K-State students each year—eight at the new building at 904 Sunset Avenue and four at our house at 908 Sunset Avenue. Students living at ECM pledge to be involved in some aspect of the campus ministry and engage in covenantal living within one of our three four-person households. Each household writes their own covenant, and a member of the ECM staff meets regularly with the households to equip the students to hold each other accountable. This coming year, we'll have four young men and eight young women living at ECM. Six are undergraduate students, six are graduate students. Four are international students. Of the twelve, eight are Christian in one its many expressions, one is Buddhist, one is Muslim and two are religiously unaffiliated—thus providing a wonderful "laboratory" for student tenants to explore their faith.



Fill the Breadbasket for Second Helping

The Second Helping is funded through our operating budget and special gifts to this ministry. On the first Sunday of each month we "Fill the Breadbasket" during worship. You are invited to bring a cash donation or items for our lunch sacks, such as individual flavored oatmeal packets, granola bars, or individually-wrapped snack crackers (such as cheese or peanut butter).

Cobb Corner — Going Green

“God’s handiwork is essential to a life of virtue. It is not an optional or secondary aspect of our Christian experience.” Pope Francis, as quoted in the *Kansas City Star*, May 26, 2017, p.15a.

Writing on the environment for a Christian congregation is getting harder these days. Consider: From 2008-2015, 172 million people around the globe abandoned their homes because of sea level rise, droughts, wildfires, sinkholes and mudslides associated with climate change. (*Population Connection*, June, 2017).

President Trump is attempting to take the U.S. out of the non-binding, voluntary Paris Climate Accord. Only two other nations are not in the agreement: Nicaragua, which decided the agreement wasn’t strong enough and Syria which has more immediate survival concerns.

During the presidential campaign of 2016, Trump stated that climate change was a hoax perpetrated by the Chinese. The Pontifical Academy of Science disagrees as does Pope Francis who gave the President the 2015 book *Laudato Si or Care for Our Common Home* during the Trump visit in May to the Vatican.

Either the President hasn’t read it or he’s not persuaded because he now argues “the tiny, tiny increase” in the earth’s temperature isn’t worth the fuss. I guess 172 million climate exiles and 195 nations just didn’t get the memo.

If you are less sanguine about the future than the President you may want to reconsider that old cliché “Think globally, act locally.” Please share your suggestions about what you are doing to protect the planet. Already, other nations are forging ahead and over 165 American cities are acting to meet the targets the U.S agreed to in 2016. Renewable energy jobs are soaring and the technology surrounding carbon capture and plastic re-purposing as well as other environmental initiatives are encouraging.

If the last paragraph seems considerably less angry than the remarks above, it’s because it was written a week later. Since then I’ve re-read the 23rd Psalm and am reading Michael Bloomberg and Carl Pope’s new book, *Climate of Hope*. I recommend both for your mental health!

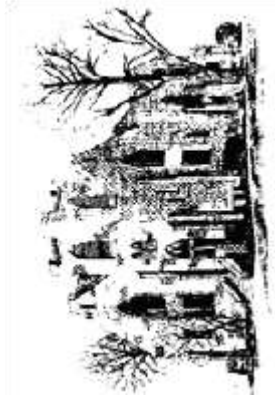
