"It's March Again"

Grief anniversaries can sneak up on us. Time and time again I've talked with people who are going through a difficult time and, in the course of the conversation, found out that they are near the time of year when they lost someone they loved. Even when we don't remember an anniversary is coming, our bodies and spirits often do.

Collectively, we are approaching the first anniversary of a major period of grief and loss. A period of grief and loss that is still unfolding. Hundreds of thousands of people - including people in our congregation - have lost a loved one to COVID. Many more have lost jobs, have been separated from loved ones, are struggling with mental health and addiction. The list goes on and on. Even those who have been extremely fortunate have found that isolation, loss of routines, and anxiety can often feel harder to bear the longer the pandemic goes on.

I know you already KNOW all of this, but I think it's worth saying again because it can be hard to remember that things are [cont. pg. 2]

still hard right now. We humans are so wonderfully adaptable that we sometimes forget what we're living through right now. We might be less productive at work or more irritable with our loved ones and chastise ourselves, "What's wrong with me?" What's wrong with all of us right now is that we're living through a global catastrophe. On a regular basis these days, 3000 or so people are dying from COVID in the U.S. alone. That's the equivalent of eight airliners falling out of the sky. That's the equivalent of a 9-11 every day. *Kyrie eleison* - Christ, have mercy.

We find ourselves in an in-between space right now. We sit with the pain of the compounding losses as we approach the one-year mark AND we rejoice as we watch healthcare workers, teachers, people we know receiving their vaccines. SUCH JOY! And for those who will be waiting a long time for their vaccines there is also a need to dig deep to find patience.

It is my prayer for you that you will be gentle with your beautiful self and with others. Allow yourself to experience your emotions each day, knowing that emotions are like the weather. They sometimes arrive unexpectedly and may stay a little longer than we'd like, but they aren't forever. If you're having persistent feelings of sadness, anger, and overwhelm, please reach out and let me know so I can connect you with the support you need.

It is my prayer for you that your faith anchors you. That you find ways of connecting with the Holy that give you the strength you need each day. If you are struggling to find spiritual practices that work for you, let's talk. Joining a small group at church like the Thursday evening prayer group, adult Sunday School, or the Tuesday book club is a GREAT way to see other people's faith in action. I always leave these gatherings strengthened and inspired.

Lately, I have used a simple breath prayer whenever I need to recenter. Using the words of the 46th Psalm, I find stillness and say to myself on an inhale, "God is our refuge and strength," and then on the exhale, "A very present help in times of trouble." After breathing that way for a few minutes, I often read the entire Psalm and then close with another breath prayer, using the words at the end of Psalm 46: (inhale) "Be still and know" (exhale) "That you are God."

Blessings on you and gratitude for you and your ministry as we keep breathing together. One day at a time. In and out. God's love is enough to sustain us now and always. May it be so.

Mondays through Wednesdays are typically best for routine meetings, as Thursdays are used for sermon and worship preparation and Friday-Saturday are her days off. Caela tries to honor work-life balance by responding to non-urgent text and voicemail messages only during regular work hours. Please note that if you ever have an emergency between the hours of 10pm-7am you will need to CALL Pastor Caela, not rely on text messages, as she does not receive them overnight.

Update to the Congregation on Cabinet news and goals for the year

At the February meeting, the church Cabinet addressed two areas that are important for the whole Congregation. Following discussion, the cabinet set two goals for the 2021 year. The first goal is to work towards re-gathering in the building and have some form of in-person worship. The COVID-19 task force appointed by the cabinet and the Accessibility and Technology Committee also appointed by the cabinet will work together through the year to develop plans and needs to accomplish this goal. We are not sure what any re-opening will look like or when that might happen, but we are committed to exploring all options as the year progresses.

The second goal is to address the budget deficit and explore ways to lower the projected deficit each year. We are thankful the Congregation did vote to approve the budget this year with a substantial deficit. Currently, no one is in favor of reducing our ministries and programs that are all vital to achieve our mission or making drastic cuts in areas that are essential to continue our program including personnel and maintenance. However, we are committed to looking at ways to increase our income.

We will explore all options that are presented to increase income and revisit how we use our invested funds in future meetings. In March we will review the plan approved in the past by the congregation that does currently address use of invested funds. We feel that is the place to start. In other months we will look at employing outside assistance in budget development, stewardship, securing grants, possible capital campaigns, and other ideas that are generated during our discussions. Please let someone on one of the boards or your moderators know of any ideas that might become part of our discussion.

We will continue to update the Congregation throughout the year on both important issues.

First Sunday also means Communion and we hope to have three options for Communion on March 7th (weather permitting):

- 1. Communion at Home @ 10:45 a.m.: we will offer Communion during our Sunday morning online worship service and you can bring your own elements to eat and drink.
- 2. Communion on the Lawn at 12:15 p.m.: we will gather on the lawn of the church building for a physically-distanced Communion using prepackaged elements (NOTE: advance sign up required. You may sign up at uccmanhattan.org/sign-ups or call the church office to reserve your space.)
- 3. **Drive Through Communion from 12:15-12:45 p.m.:** drive through the alley behind the church building to receive prepackaged Communion elements (no sign up needed)

If plans change due to inclement weather we will announce that during worship on the 7th. A reminder that you are invited to drop off donations for the Second Helping when you come to the church. Helpful items include individual flavored oatmeal packets, granola bars, or individually-wrapped snack crackers (such as cheese or peanut butter).

Cobb Corner — Going Green

"The faithful will abound with blessings but one who is in a hurry to be rich will not go unpunished."

- Proverbs 28-20. The Green Bible, p. 643.

I just finished a critically important book: *The New Climate War: The Fight to Take Back our Planet*, by Michael E. Mann, 2021. It is a detailed and meticulously documented expose of the strategies being utilized by the fossil fuel industries to encourage doubt, to delay change, to deny a crisis exists, to deflect concern toward personal rather than political action, or to assume doom is unavoidable.

It examines how they use the very same tactics as the tobacco, pesticide, and gun lobbies. Some examples: "Guns Don't Kill People, People Do" or "Doubt is our product, since it is the best means of competing with the body of fact that exists in the minds of the general public." –from a 1969 tobacco executive in a staff memo.(Mann, p. 9.)

A third tactic is to attack the messenger as the pesticide industry did with Rachel Carson's *The Silent Spring* evidence about DDT or with Carl Sagan and James Hansen when they sounded the alarm about climate change in the 1980s.

"Deflection" occurs when people are encouraged to focus on something else, particularly personal actions: You recycle aluminum but don't protest the Keystone Pipeline or encourage disinvestment in oil, gas, and coal companies! Or they put the emphasis on coal miners losing their jobs, but not on black lung disease, mountain top removal or contaminated streams. Nor do they note renewable energy jobs are safer, pay better, and are already more numerous than the fossil fuel jobs combined!

An example is the TV ad now playing sponsored by "energy citizens" bemoaning how President Biden 's proposed ban on oil and gas leasing on public lands will bankrupt schools and state governments. A similar letter appeared in *The Mercury* in February.

What they don't mention is that the proposed covid relief bill includes needed support for state and local governments. By

cutting the enormous subsidies that the federal government pays such industries, governments will have far more resources!
