### An Invitation to Regather in our Sanctuary Beginning June 27, 2021

Dear First Congregational members and friends,

Over the past 15 months, we know we've written you a lot of letters about Being the Church During a Pandemic. We are so grateful for all you've done to prioritize the health and well-being of our community, especially those most vulnerable among us. Throughout the pandemic, our leadership has been carefully and prayerfully following all kinds of metrics, awaiting the day when we could write you THIS particular letter.

In hope and thanksgiving, we prayerfully plan to open our sanctuary for in-person worship on June 27, 2021. [continued pg. 2]

We also remain committed to providing a robust online option for those who don't yet feel ready to return to in-person worship, need to worship at home for other reasons, or live outside the Manhattan area.

We've been listening to public health experts and will continue to do so. We considered many factors when choosing this as a target date: vaccine availability and rates of vaccination in our county, positivity rates in our area, decreased hospitalizations, the health and wellness of our staff, and our ability to provide quality in-person and online worship at the same time. If we've learned anything this past year, it's that things sometimes change rapidly. We remain committed to loving our neighbors by listening to science and protecting our community, so if we need to slow down or take a step back in the future, we will do so.

Beginning June 27, you will be welcome to worship in-person at 10:45 a.m. in our sanctuary. You can view our full COVID policies on our website, but here are the highlights:

- Everyone over the age of 5 will need to wear a mask that covers their mouth and nose, regardless of vaccination status. Please keep in mind that many people, including all children under the age of 12, are still not able to be vaccinated and we remain committed to creating the safest environment possible for them. You can read more details about our current masking policies on page 6.
- The pews will mark spaces that are available for seating. You
  may choose where you would like to sit, maintaining at least
  six feet distance from those outside your household. At this
  time, we don't anticipate requiring advance sign ups, but if that
  changes we will be sure to let you know.
- We will not be providing nursery or other childcare this summer, but are working towards offering those options in the fall.
- We will continue to limit singing and wind instruments, as we know these activities carry an increased risk of spreading the virus. Our current plan is to sing one hymn each Sunday. We will ask people to sing quietly and we will, of course, all be masked while singing.
- We ask that people leave the building as soon as the service ends and encourage you to bring a lawn chair or blanket to enjoy distanced fellowship on the lawn together after worship. You may remove your mask outdoors, if you'd like.

We are so delighted to be taking this next step together. The past 15 years - oops, months - have taught us that God continues to show up wherever we are. What a gift. We can't wait to see how the Spirit continues to move among us at 700 Poyntz AND in our homes and Zoom rooms and everywhere else in the whole wide world.

As we prepare for this transition, we encourage you to reach out if you have any questions about our plan. We continue to give thanks for your flexibility and grace as we move through this period of holy experimentation. We know we will get some things right and other things wrong as we continue to move and shift and transform under the Spirit's care. We'll do it all together - and we trust that God accompanies us every step of the way.

### Connecting with Pastor Caela

Please note that if you ever have an emergency between the hours of 10pm-7am you will need to CALL Pastor Caela, not rely on text messages, as she does not receive them overnight.

### Update from Cabinet about Masks

...we know that "all of us possess knowledge." Knowledge puffs up, but love builds up. (1 Cor 8:1, NRSV)

In light of recent guidance released by the Centers for Disease Control advising that vaccinated Americans can go without masks or social distancing in most public settings, you may be wondering, "What does this mean for our congregation?" Our Church Cabinet discussed this question at our May meeting. We've been following helpful guidance from the Wisconsin Council of Churches throughout the pandemic and they are currently recommending following a "two out of three" approach. So for indoor gatherings, masks + distancing are recommended. When outdoors, distancing is sufficient. [1]

Our current policies regarding masks are:

- <u>Indoors</u>: We continue to require masks for everyone over the age of five, regardless of vaccination status, inside the church building and at indoor church events. If you forget your mask, we have some on hand to share.
- Outdoors: Masks are not required at outdoor church gatherings where distancing is maintained. You are still very welcome to wear a mask if you'd like.

Though we know many in our congregation are vaccinated (yay! wonderful!) we also know that our congregation is blessed with the presence of many children under the age of 12 and others who are unable to be vaccinated. Continuing to wear our masks is an act of hospitality and care for the most vulnerable among us. Masks and social distancing will help ensure that children and others who are unable to be vaccinated won't have to guess at the vaccination status of everyone at our public gatherings.

Our Conference Minister, Dr. Edith Guffey said it well in a recent communication to the KO Conference: "While the church is indeed a public space, not all public spaces are the same. Not all public spaces declare themselves to be the Body of Christ as churches do. Consequently, not all public spaces are as concerned about the common health of ALL who share the space." [2]

Thank you for caring about the common health of our entire community - especially the young children and others in our community who cannot receive the vaccine. The simple act of continuing to wear our masks while attending indoor church events is an act of hospitality and Christ-like love for our wider community. Our leadership will continue to listen to scientists and public health officials as our practices evolve over the coming months. ### Cobb Corner — Going Green

"I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams and the fat of fed beasts. I do not delight in the blood of bulls or of lambs, or of goats."

- Isaiah, 1:11, p. 661, The Green Bible

Cautionary words as we enter the barbecue season! Keep up those Meatless Mondays!

It is another environmental hazard I want to stress today as fire season starts in the West and the Flint Hills burn: air pollution.

The April, 2021, issue of *National Geographic* has an exceptional account of this subject on pp. 40-66. Over seven million people are estimated to die prematurely annually from air pollution. In fact more people died of air pollution even in this year of lockdowns than from Covid! This figure is five times the number from auto accidents.

I first became aware of huge-scale air pollution more than 50 years ago while living in India. In winter the air was choked with smoke. Even our kids noticed. Three-year old Mark would toddle over to vendors cooking corn or bananas over charcoal fires and wave his finger and warn "No No, Hot Hot". The population today is 300% higher and 9 of the 10 most polluted cities are in India.

Forty years ago I was traveling with K-State librarian, Sylvia Blanding, just as China was opening to tourists from non-Communist countries. There were millions of bikes, but few cars and buses there. Still the coal fires in December had blackened the skies. Despite my glasses a lump of coal dust got in my eye and it was so big it required medical attention to remove it. Even then people wore masks in the winter.

It has been 50 years since the U.S. passed the Clean Air Act but 45% of the population still breathe bad air. In December, 2020, the Trump administration's E.P.A. declined to adopt a recommended standard that was estimated to save 12,000 lives a year!

Getting involved politically is essential if we are to do justice to the world we've been given.


