

Stewardship: At-Home Discernment Guide

In November, we will come together as a congregation to offer pledges of financial support for the work of First Congregational UCC in the coming year. During worship we will gather and dedicate our pledge cards. **As you prepare to fill out your card, we hope you will spend some time in individual or family discernment about the gifts you can offer in the coming year.** If you make your financial decisions independently, you may wish to spend time in prayer, journaling, or drawing. If you are a part of a family unit, you may wish to come together for discussion or family prayer. These three questions, written by the Rev. Anthony B. Robinson, a UCC pastor, may be useful during your time of discernment.

Questions for Reflection, Discussion, and Action:

1. What is your personal stewardship story? What lessons have you learned about money, about giving, about stewardship? Who have been your teachers? What's been helpful to you and what has proven unhelpful?
2. Discuss or reflect upon the connection between your money and your life as you see it and experience it.
3. What was an experience of giving and generosity in your own life that was meaningful to you and by which you were, at least in some measure, changed or transformed? This may be in or outside the church.
